At the White Center Pride Committee (WCPC), we believe in the abundant potential of the LGBTQ+ Community with acceptance and emotional well-being, which lead to economic and social mobility. As communities still reeling from the economic and emotional losses of the pandemic contend with decreases of resources and business opportunity, the WCPC continues to be a partner to our community members seeking community and the tools needed to thrive. Our whole-family approach enables us to intervene at critical stages of development by offering programs that provide access to diverse, growth-minded learning and connecting local businesses to opportunities and networking. We partner with community organizations, local leaders, and libraries to build networks of care that respond to local needs and create more growth-minded spaces, increasing the community's capacity for acceptance and resilience. With our community's help in the last year, we held a massively successful roster of events and had the highest attendance at our Pride Street Festival in June with over one hundred vendors and thousands of attendees. To continue this success, we ask our community to be on the lookout for various quarterly events in the new year, including our Pride Street Festival to be held on Saturday, June 6, 2026.

#### 2. Mission and Vision

- **Mission:** Our mission is to foster a diverse LGBTQIA+ community in White Center through year-round events, grassroots efforts, and community initiatives.
- **Vision:** To create a vibrant and welcoming White Center where LGBTQIA+ individuals are embraced, valued, and empowered to live authentically, contributing to a community that thrives on diversity and inclusivity.

### 3. Key Achievements

- Successful Pride Street Festival: Our 6<sup>th</sup> annual Pride Street Festival saw a record attendance, over one hundred vendors, highlighting the strength and unity of our community.
- **Pride Story Time:** We have continued our partnership with the White Center Library in having Pride Story time quarterly throughout the year reaching over one hundred young individuals.
- Spring Children's Event: This is our fifth year of providing buckets of goodies to the
  children of White Center. This year, we partnered with DubSea Coffee to build upon
  our event in the Greenbridge neighborhood. We were able to provide over 150
  goodie buckets for the children of our community.
- **Community Fundraising:** Raised \$12,000 through various fundraising efforts.

The financial health of White Center Pride Committee remains strong, with careful management of resources ensuring sustainable growth.

### 5. Events and Programs (including but not limited to)

- Pride Month Celebrations: A month-long series of events, including the Pride Street Festival, community fairs, Pride Night at Steve Cox Memorial Park with Dubsea Fishsticks, and educational engagements.
- **Health and Wellness Initiatives:** Partnerships with healthcare providers to offer free health screenings and vaccine services as well as referrals to Social Services.
- Local Business Partnership: Continued focus on partnering with local businesses to drive LGBTQ+ participation and building community.

White Center Pride has made significant strides in engaging the community through various outreach initiatives:

- **Social Media Campaigns:** Increased our online presence, reaching over 10,000 followers across various platforms.
- **Volunteer Program:** Expanded our volunteer base to 120 active members who contribute their time and skills to our cause. We partnered with Gay For Good to increase our volunteer base.
- Community Partnerships: Strengthened ties with local businesses and organizations to support LGBTQ+ rights and visibility.

### 7. Partnerships and Collaborations

- **Local Businesses:** Partnered with over one hundred local businesses to sponsor events and provide resources.
- **Non-Profit Organizations:** Collaborated with other non-profits to enhance our outreach and support services.
